



## **Technical Note No.1: Club Competitions and Trophies**

### **1. Boating Competitions**

1.1. The following **'boating'** competitions are currently run on an annual basis with trophies being presented to the winners at the end of the year, usually at the AGM.

1.2. Fast Electric:

1.2.1. Club 500 (See Technical Note 2 for details)

1.2.2. 'Tenshock' Mini Eco (See Technical Note 3 for details)

1.3. Scale Steering competition: (See Technical Note 4 for details)

1.3.1. Large (boats over 40 inches long)

1.3.2. Medium (boats over 23 inches and under 40 inches long)

1.3.3. Small class (boats under 23 inches long)

1.4. Tony Rose Memorial Cup:

1.4.1. This cup is presented to the winner of the 'open class' steering regatta held at the Frostbite Regatta, usually the first Sunday in the year.

1.5. Sailing: (See Technical Note 5 - 'Sailing Regattas')

1.5.1. A sailing regatta is normally held once per month throughout the year, with the year being split into a 'Summer Series' and a 'Winter Series'. These regattas are run on an 'open class' basis and trophies are presented to the winner of each series.

### **2. Boat Building Judging (Static Judged)**

2.1. Prototype Cup: (Senior and Junior)

2.1.1. These cups are awarded annually to the builders of the best entirely 'scratch built' models. However, the amount of commercially sourced parts will be taken into account when judging. Such models must:

- Be have been constructed solely by the entrant.
- May only win the trophy once.
- Model must be working order.

2.1.2. The judges will award points for the standard of workmanship; complexity of the model, accuracy of scale and overall appearance. If the model is a scale representation of a full size vessel then 'faithfulness' to the original shall also be taken into consideration. If the models fittings are predominantly homemade these will score over a model which has predominantly 'commercial' fittings. The best senior and junior entries are awarded the prototype cups.



## 2.2. Go Fast Trophy (*Senior Cup*) and Dale Tremble (*Junior Cup*)

2.2.1. These cups are awarded annually to builders of the best '**kit built**' models. This category of model may also include 'semi-kits', where the major component parts e.g. hulls, may have been commercially sourced and constructed from GRP etc. Such models must:

- Have been constructed solely by the entrant.
- May only win the trophy once.
- Model must be working order.

2.2.2. The judges will award points for the standard of workmanship; complexity of the model, accuracy of scale and overall appearance. If the model is a scale representation of a full size vessel then 'faithfulness' to the original shall also be taken into consideration. If the model includes some homemade fittings these will score over a model which has predominantly 'commercial' fittings. The best senior and junior entries are awarded the prototype cups.

## 3. The Vice Chairman's Cup

3.1. Vice Chairman's cup is awarded to a **non-committee member** who has given exceptional support to the Club during the past year.
